### GRANT OF MONETARY RELIEF TO AGGRIEVED PERSONS

- 1. Grant of monetary relief to families of persons who died and to persons who suffered injury or damage to property due to the following categories of incidents is considered by the Office for Reparations, ie.
  - a. the armed conflict which took place in the Northern and Eastern Provinces or its aftermath; or
  - b. due to political unrest or civil disturbances; or
  - c. due to an enforced disappearance as defined in the International Convention for the Protection of all Persons from Enforced Disappearance Act, No. 5 of 2018;
  - d. such damage being in the nature of prolong and grave damage suffered by individuals, groups or communities of people of Sri Lanka.
- 2. Applications from persons aggrieved by these incidents were entertained from 1983 to March 2018 by the Rehabilitation of Persons, Property and Enterprises Authority (REPPIA) which was the Authority to handle grant of compensation upto March 2018 and thereafter by the Office for Reparations. The schemes that were adopted to determine the quantum of relief were those approved by the Cabinet of Ministers upto 2019. Thereafter, the quantum has been determined by the Office for Reparations, in terms of its Policy and Guidelines.
- 3. Monetary relief has been considered in respect of the following incidents
  - a) The ethnic conflict which prevailed in the Northern and Eastern Provinces (1983 onwards)
  - b) The following incidents that occurred outside the North and East upto 2018
    - i. Civil unrest in Beruwela (January 2006)
    - ii. Riot inside the Welikada Prison (November 2012)
    - iii. Civil unrest in Beruwela and Aluthgama (June 2014)
    - iv. Civil unrest in Gintota (November, 2017)
    - v. Civil unrest in Amparai (February, 2018)
    - vi. Civil unrest in Kandy District (March 2018)
  - c) The following incidents that occurred after the establishment of the Office for Reparations ie. From 2019
    - i. Easter Sunday Attack (April 2019)
    - ii. The aftermath of the Easter Sunday Attack (May 2019)
    - iii. Political disturbances and civil unrest that occurred in 2022.
- 4. Compensation is considered on account of
  - a) the loss of life of a member of the family of the aggrieved person
  - b) injuries suffered by an aggrieved person
  - c) loss or damage to private property owned by an aggrieved person
  - d) damage to places of religious worship.
- 5. The schemes-

The persons who were considered eligible to claim monetary relief, the documents that were required to be submitted as proof, and the quantum that was approved to be granted, are set out in Parts 1 to 11 in Schedule 1, under the following categories:

### Ethnic conflict :

- a. Death of a Public Officer due to the ethnic conflict see Part 1
- **b.** Death of a member of the public due to the ethnic conflict see Part 2.
- c. Injury to a public officer due to the ethnic conflict see Part 3
- d. Injury to a member of the public due to the ethnic conflict see Part 4
- e. Loss of or damage to property owned by a Public Officer, due to the ethnic conflict See Part 5
- f. Loss of or damage to property owned by a Member of the Public, due to the ethnic conflict See Part 6
- g. Loss or damage to places of religious worship, due to the ethnic conflict see Part 7

#### Civil unrest outside the North and East:

- a) Death due to civil unrest incidents see Part 8
- b) Injury due to civil unrest incidents see Part 9
- c) Loss of or damage to private property due to civil unrest incidents see Part 10
- d) Loss of or damage to places of religious worship due to civil unrest incidents see Part 11
